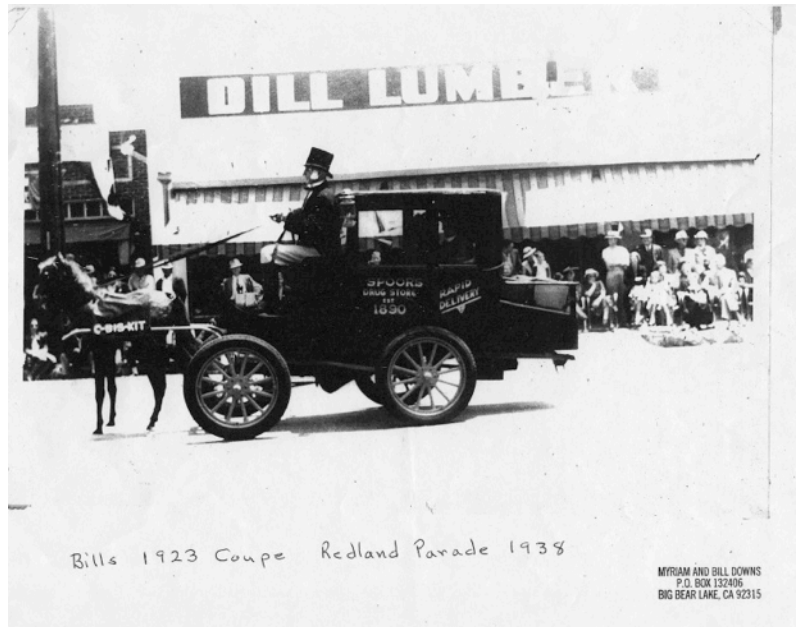


Bill's 1923 Coupe
Redlands Parade 1938

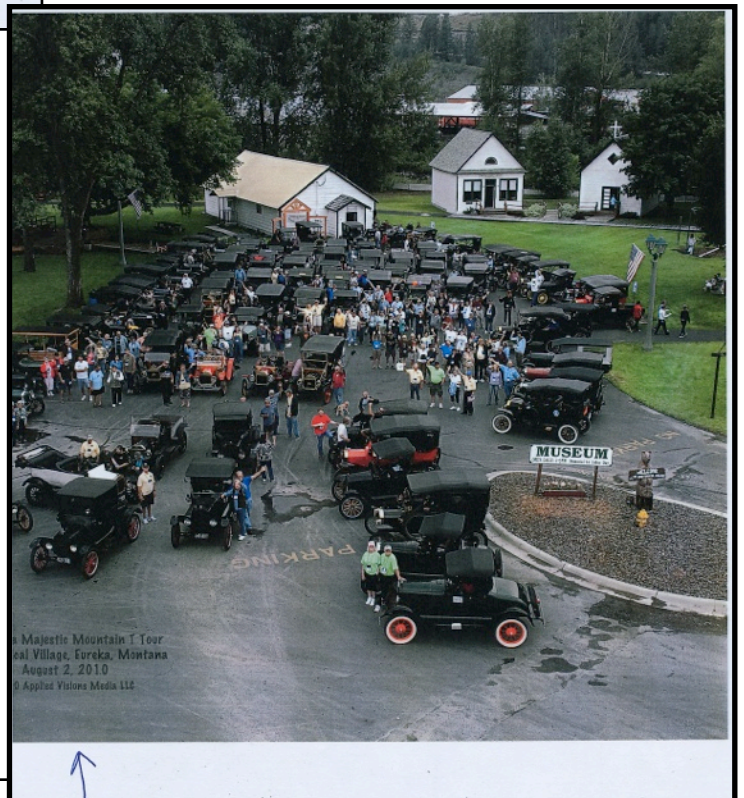


Bill Downs 1923 model T Coupe, was driven down Route 66 To Redlands, California in 1937. Bills Uncle Wilson Spoor, who owned a drug store in Redlands, bought the Coupe for \$5,00. Wilson took it to a blacksmith, had it made into a bucking stage coach for a Redlands parade in 1938. After the parade Wilson put the T in his barn, it sat there until 1956 when Wilson died. Bills Aunt gave the T To Bill along with a box of old Coins. When Bill picked up the T it still had the paper maché horse on the front, Bill took a 1909 SVDP penny to his home town Junkatigue, for the penny he got a new frame, fenders, drive shaft, headlights, running boards, and splash aprons. Bill didn't know he should junk the car so he put it back together and drove it to high school, Bill has had this car for 55 years.
